Following yesterday's Special Election County Auditor Dusty Rhodes has re-issued a comparison of school tax levies in each of Hamilton County's twenty-three school districts.

"For the first time this allows residents to determine where their district will rank among the County's districts in terms of actual tax cost," said Rhodes. Formerly all that could be compared were tax millage rates which require various conversions to arrive at readily understandable numbers.

Following are the schools' portion of the total property tax bill paid by an owner-occupied residence for each \$100,000 of market value.
